We are looking for **stroke survivors** aged over 18 years, who have some difficulties using their hand and arm (with some ability to reach for objects).

We are testing a brain stimulation intervention and seeking to **understand how it affects movement function and brain activity**.

Join us for a study that includes **3 visits**. The first visit will be at John Radcliffe Hospital. The second and third visits can be at the hospital or in your home. You will be invited to fill out questionnaires and try out movement tasks. We will measure your brain activity. During your second and third visits, we will deliver a safe and painless type of brain stimulation, measure your brain activity and the movement of your hand and arm.

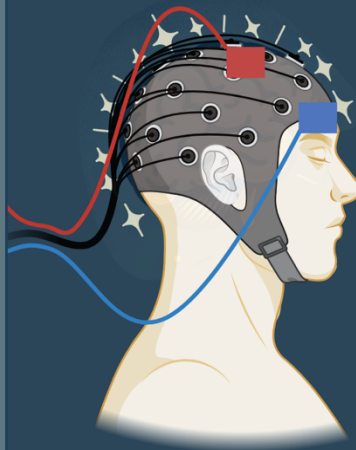
You will be compensated for your time and travel expenses.
